# Legal Resources for Low-Income Elders

The Executive Office of Elder Affairs has collected information resources related to legal services for low-income elder consumers. It is available only for the state of Massachusetts. The following document contains information related to General Legal Service Resources, Title III-B Legal Service Providers, Court Service Centers and Training/Education Resources for Professionals.

<u>General Legal Service Resources</u> - General information regarding legal service assistance available to elders and their caregivers; primarily geared to low income elders.

<u>Title III-B Legal Service Providers (LSP)</u> - Efforts to target Older Americans Act Title III-B legal resources to elders 60+ in greatest economic and social need are critical given limited resources. Title III-B funding is to be targeted to certain case priorities including, income; health care; long-term care; nutrition; housing; utilities; protective services; defense of older persons against guardianship; abuse; neglect; and age discrimination.

<u>Court Service Centers</u> - Helps people navigate the court system. Centers are open whenever the courts are open, and are available to all court users without attorneys. All of the services are free, but there may be other fees associated with a case, such as filing fees.

<u>Basic Public Benefits/Advocacy Training Series</u> - Massachusetts Law Reform Institute (MLRI) and Massachusetts Continuing Legal Education, Inc. (MCLE) present a series of trainings every year for legal, social, health services, and community advocates who assist low- and moderate-income individuals and families. Each session includes substantive materials and is led by expert advocates from legal services programs throughout the state.

If there is any emergency after that time please consult the clerk/register of that court center.

### **Court Service Centers\*\*\***

Court Service Centers help people navigate the court system. Centers are open whenever the courts are open, and are available to all court users, with or without attorneys.

### **SERVICES**

- Computers with access to online resources that are available on a first-come, first-served basis
- One-on-one help filling out court forms
- Information about court rules, procedures, and practices
- Court documents and written instructions
- Access to interpreter services
- Assistance with legal research
- Contact information for community resources, legal assistance programs, and social service agencies
- Some forms and self-help materials are available in multiple languages. If you don't speak English well, you have the right to an interpreter at no cost to you. Ask court staff for an interpreter and they'll provide one for you.

\*\*\*Court Service Center staff can give legal information, but not legal advice. Legal information includes answering questions about how the court works and the different options available to you. The staff can't help decide what you should do or predict what will happen in a case. Court staff may give information to all parties to a case, and can't act as your attorney.
